

Match activities between the Big and the Little are the heart of Big Brothers Big Sisters. It is through these activities that the relationship between the Big and the Little develops. It is through the relationship that positive outcomes occur.

The STAR Concept describes how best to carry out each activity between a Big and Little

- SHOW up. It is important to honor commitment-to be on time for planned activities, to meet once a week, and to continue the match for at least one year.
- ❖ TOGETHER decide on activities. The relationship should not be dictated by any one participant. Relationships develop best when both the Big and the Little have a voice in deciding what to do. Ideally, try to find activities which they both enjoy, or it not, alternate between what one prefers and then the other.
- ❖ ALWAYS have fun. Although the match has goals described at the initial Match Meeting, it is always most important that the relationship between the Big and Little be FUN! The challenge is to intertwine fun activities which also build personal strengths and expose the child to new experiences.
- * REWARD and praise. The Big is encouraged to build frequent praise language in talking with the Little. Praise is best expressed with positive affirmations

In this packet we have provided you with some STAR activities to get your match started. Your Match Support Specialist will provide future activities to keep you and your Little engaged and having fun!

Materials for many of these activities can be found at the school you are volunteering at and some may require you to bring materials from home. It is encouraged to always talk to your Little about future activities so you can have a plan to bring materials from home and collect from the school as needed. If you ever need help getting materials for a specific activity, please talk to your Match Support Specialist.

Lego Bridge Challenge!

Build a bridge with your Big that is able to cross the 'river' and also hold different objects without collapsing! See examples below.

- Legos
- Paper and markers to make 'river'
- Items to stack on top of Lego bridge









Build a Collage with your Little!

Your collage could just be things you liked or it could have themes, such as 'Ocean', 'Christmas' or 'Friendship'! See examples below.

Materials needed: *materials needed from home!

- Blank paper for the collage
- Age appropriate magazines or newspapers to cut up
- Scissors, glue, or tape







Make your own Fortune Teller!

- Markers or colored pencils






Make a homemade card with your Little

- Or plan ahead and type up and print out a hunt




Plan a Trip With Your Little!

- Old magazines to cut and use photos from


Or print out the attached templet
